There is a whole exhibit in the library with all of this information. We wanted to create a resolution to bring attention to this part of our school's history. This would potentially lead to an initiative with Black History Month and maybe we can include athletics too.
 2. Morales: I also thought maybe we could do a charity football game and any money we earn could go to desegregation of schools, but this is just an idea.
- C. Voter Registration Week- Briana Maturi
1. I am here to talk about voter registration and education. November 6th is the national midterm elections. Voters who are college-aged are the highest number of eligible voters, but the least number of actual voters. Part of being committed to service and justice means voting. After a big voting registration push, we are going to be pushing voter education and understanding your ballot. TurboVote is a non-partisan company getting people to vote and keeping people informed. Even for students who are registered to vote, we want them to get them signed up for more voter information and help with voting by mail for out of state students. Lmu.turbovote.org, also on LEO and PROWL. This helps us understand who is registered to vote and who is participating, which helps as we move to the education portion, so we know who to reach out to. If we are getting students voting on a national level, it is easier to get students voting in ASLMU elections. Please think of ways to actively engage your constituents and people in groups you are a part of. We are tabling all week from 10am-2pm. We need more people to sign up and table, the more help I can get the better. If you can share the graphics on social media and promote, promote, promote!

 2. We are asking for funds for our annual program called Muevelo and proceeds go to Upward Bound in Westchester.
 3. Our LSU mission is to create an inclusive and diverse group on campus that supports the Latinx community. Muevelo is a dance open to all LMU students.

4. Muevelo will be on November 9th at Roski's. We are expecting 300 participants. The event includes DJ, food, dance floor, and photo booth. We sell tickets \$10 pre-sale and \$15 at the door. \$2,000 donation will be made to Upward Bound. Asking for a total of **\$2,909.01**.
5. Total Budget with DJ, photo booth, dance floor, food platters, Sodexo water and linens, napkins and plates, advertising costs, and giveaways equals **\$3,125**.
6. Upward Bound has a commitment to educational equity by helping first generation/low income/high school students with the process of getting into college.
7. Promotion: will make an effort to reach out to other orgs like BSU, Isang Bansa, MEChA, CLSS, and other schools nearby, something that has not been done in previous years.
